#### The Voice Parts

Barbershop harmony is vocal harmony produced by four parts: Tenor, Lead, Baritone, and Bass. It is sung a cappella – without any accompaniment of any musical instruments.

**TENOR** is a harmony part sung consistently above the lead, or melody line. The tenor should have a light, sweet, pure tone that will compliment, but not overpower the lead. It is in the treble clef and are the top notes on your music with the stems going up.

**LEAD** is the melody part and is sung in the range between A below middle C and C above middle C. The other three parts harmonize with the Lead voice. This is also in the treble clef and will be the second line of notes with the stems going down.

**BARITONE** is a lower harmony part that covers about the same range as Lead. The baritone harmony notes are sung mostly below, and sometimes above the lead. Baritone is in the bass clef on the top line, and the stems are going up.

**BASS** singers should have a rich, mellow voice and be able to easily sing the E flat below middle C. Bass is in the bass clef and is the bottom line of notes, with the stems pointing down.
